The Theatre Group offers a gem at SBCC

THE JURKOWITZ THEATRE AT SBCC is presenting a devastating and emotional winner: David Lindsay-Adaire's 2007 Pulitzer Prize winning play *Rabbit Hole* about the overwhelming power and pain of grief and loss from the tragedy of death. When it's personal, there is no ending, no time limit, no score to say 'that's

enough, move on now.' It's 2006 in Howie and Becca's upper-middle class home in Larchmont, New York. "Becca" (Leslie Gangl Howe, a masterful, complex, and deeply delineated portrayal) and her younger sister "Izzy" (Shannon Saleh, eccentric and handling an emotional roller coaster

beautifully) are quietly conversing as Becca folds the clothes of a small child, her recently deceased four year old son Danny, while Izzy is explaining a funny incident she had earlier that morning that led her to slug a woman in the face for...she knows not why.

The turn from odd behavior and funny talk to the twist to tragedy is the major turn in Lindsay-Adaire's brilliant play. Grief is pervasive; it grows as a cancer affecting each family member differently (the audience, too).

This leads to isolation for everyone, Becca and her husband "Howie" (Paul Canter, trapped, like a caged tiger), her sister Izzy, and their mother "Nat" (Elaine Arnett, caught in her elusive world of make-believe). It takes the neighbor kid "Jason" (Ryan Ostendorf, pained with guilt) who drove the car

that caused the accidental death to start a pathway to salvation.

In the genre of unrelenting drama like *'night Mother*, there is no rescue from the torment. Howie wants to move on, to try romance with his wife, Becca. He wants memories of Danny all around; Becca wants to erase all of Danny from their lives. Taking down pictures from the fridge, removing all photos, and accidentally erasing a video which enrages Howie.

Whatever is said is always the wrong thing, further alienating each of these woeful mourners and their pain just grows. Mom Nat, tries to offer advice by saying the Kennedy's suffered their tragedies dearly.

The high school student Jason, finally cracks the family's barrier wall. He arrives unannounced to

apologize for the accident and offer his condolences. His arrival allows Howie to vent some of his anger, sending Jason home as the remaining family members continue to play out their dream-like mesmerizing grief. Nat answers her daughter's query, "Does it ever go away?" with "It can fade for a while, but it always returns."

The ghost-like behavior carries on in the relentless despair of the characters, always visible to us, if not to each other. Their heartache cries out! It is an extraordinary evening of theatre.

Directed with delicacy by Katie Laris, this is a perfectly crafted ensemble. The company of actors is sublime; sets and lighting by Francois-Pierre Couture and costumes by Pamela Shaw are spot-on.
